A Word from Pastor Wieber

Dear Beloved in the Lord,

On Sunday, February 2, 2020, we celebrated the Presentation of our Lord.

Forty days after the birth of Jesus we mark the day Mary and Joseph presented him in the temple in accordance with Jewish law. There they were greeted by Simeon, an aged priest who offered the prayer *Nunc Dimittis* "Lord, now you let your servant depart in peace," as well as by the prophet Anna, who spoke of the redemption of Israel.

The Presentation of Our Lord is also referred to as Candlemas because of an ancient tradition of blessing all the candles to be used in the church in the coming year at the mass celebrated on that day. It was a way of underscoring the truth of Simeon's confession that this baby Jesus was "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" and a light for glory to Israel.



Let the light of every candle in church be a little epiphany of the love of God for all people in the person of God's son, Jesus, the light of the world. We shall rejoice in him.

Starts at 6:00PM with a light supper followed by a discussion about the meaning of the acronym ELCA. Worship services will begin at 7:30PM.



While I'm doing thank you's, I want to also thank you all for the calls, cards, and mostly for the prayers said for me during this






